"In the corner of the yard was the wash-house with a galvanized tub with poss stick for washing, a bench for scrubbing and a set-pot built into the wall. This was for boiling the clothes. It had an open fire underneath and we would carry a shovelful of burning coals from the fire to get it going. Clothes washing was a very hard task



and took up the whole day. Without fail, every Monday was washing day." *From* "Remembering the past" What are your memories of washing day in your house? Your grandmother's house? Your neighbour's house? Do you remember any funny incidents associated with wash day? Did you swing on the Hills Hoist and get into trouble? What job did you help with? Did your Mum have Reckitt's blue bags for the whites? Was the wash house on the verandah? Did you have a mangle over cement wash troughs? A copper for heating water?

At our next Jabberfest we are looking to hear your short personal memories of washing day. You can write them down to be read out, or included in JJ over the next few months. We all have memories which are very different from today's wash days. If you have any washday


COVID-19 REGULATIONS
